Sarah,

Based on my research of the area in question (T. 18N R. 54E Sec. 6), these lands appear to have been vacant and unappropriated. Prior to 1933 there was no right-of-way on what is now Highway 50. This route was known as the Lincoln Highway prior that, however the Lincoln Highway was a route promoted by the Lincoln Highway Association which was created in 1913 to promote the road using private and corporate donations. Basically, it was a collection of existing roads used to connect population centers in the United States. The route changed a number of times over the years based on those private and corporate donations that were used to fund the project. Often routes were specifically chosen to ensure that the route included businesses that provided funding to ensure that they got business from travelers along the route. There was never any Federal Action taken that would have transferred any Federal Rights or Obligations along this route out of Federal control.

Let me know if you need anymore details on this subject. There is a lot of history associated with this route but very little of it involves the transfer of lands or rights out of Federal responsibility.
