AREA MANAGER'S FINAL MULTIPLE USE DECISION FOR THE FLYNN/PARMAN/JIGGS ALLOTMENTS

The Record of Decision for the Shoshone-Eureka Environmental Impact Statement and Resource Management Plan (RMP) was issued on March 10, 1986. A subsequent RMP Amendment and Record of Decision was issued November 6, 1987. These documents established the multiple use goals and objectives which guide management of the public lands within these allotments. The Rangeland Program summary (RPS) was issued in December, 1988 which further identified the allotment specific objectives for the Flynn/Parman and Jiggs allotments.

As identified in the Shoshone-Eureka Land Use Plan (LUP) and RPS, monitoring was established on these allotments to determine if existing multiple uses for the allotments were consistent with attainment of the objectives established by the LUP. Monitoring data has been collected in these allotments since 1990 and has been analyzed during the past 12 months through the allotment evaluation process, to determine progress in meeting multiple use objectives for this allotment, and to determine what changes in existing management are required in order to meet these objectives.

The specific multiple use objectives for the Flynn/Parman and Jiggs Allotments are listed below:

FLYNN/PARMAN:

A. Vegetation and Ecological Condition:

1. Utilization not to exceed 50% on key species by seed dissemination, and 60% by end of grazing year.
2. In the long term, improve 4,520 acres to good, and 232 acres to excellent condition.
3. In the long term, manage for upward trend on 4,752 acres.

- B. Livestock Use:
 - 1. In the short term manage at 1,226 AUMs.
 - 2. In the long term, manage use of 1,442 AUMs in conformance with other objectives of the RMP.
- C. Wildlife Use:
 - 1. Utilization of key browse species not to exceed 50% in terrestrial big game habitat areas.
 - 2. Existing wildlife AUMs is 582. In the long term, provide habitat to support 565 AUMs (forage needs for reasonable numbers) of big game use, in conformance with other objectives of the RMP.
 - 3. Manage rangeland habitat to maintain or enhance sage grouse strutting and nesting areas, in conformance with other RMP objectives.

JIGGS:

- A. Vegetation and Ecological Condition:
 - 1. Utilization not to exceed 50% on key species by seed dissemination, and 60% by the end of the grazing year.
- B. Livestock Use:
 - 1. In the long term manage use of 636 AUMs in conformance with other objectives of the RMP.
- C. Wildlife Use:
 - 1. Utilization of key browse species not to exceed 50% in terrestrial big game habitat.

Through the allotment evaluation process it was determined that the following vegetation objectives were not fully being met and the key browse species objectives were not met, indicating that a change in existing management is required in order to meet all of the multiple use objectives for these allotments:

Flynn/Parman:

- Vegetation and Ecological Condition:
 - A1- Average utilization on key species has not exceeded 60%. Therefore, this objective has been met. However, there are areas in the allotment that have sustained continuous heavy use throughout the evaluation: Stimpson Spring, Ryepatch Well, Bald Mountain Well, and Rocky Gulch. These areas have not met this objective.
 - A2- Ecological condition was gathered once. Therefore, it cannot be determined whether this objective has been met.
 - A3- Trend data is incomplete. Therefore, it cannot be determined if this objective has been met.

Livestock:

- B1,2-During this evaluation active use has ranged from 763 AUMs to 1,509 AUMs. Therefore, these objectives have been exceeded.

Wildlife:

- C1- Average utilization on key browse species has exceeded 50%. Therefore, this objective has not been met. Wildlife data indicates the heavy use on key browse species can be attributed to livestock over grazing during summer months.
- C2- There has not been any actual use data collected on wildlife. Therefore, it cannot be determined whether this objective has been met.
- C3- There is no sufficient data to indicate sage grouse strutting and nesting areas have been enhanced. Therefore, it cannot be determined whether this objective has been met.

JIGGS:

Vegetation and Ecological Condition:

- A1- Average utilization data on key species has not exceeded 60%. Therefore, this objective has been met. However, there are areas in the allotment that have sustained heavy use throughout the evaluation period: Willow Spring and Burro Well. These areas have not met this objective.

Livestock Use:

- A1- During this evaluation active use has ranged from 433 to 806 AUMs. Therefore, this objective has been exceeded.

Wildlife Use:

- A1- Average utilization on key browse species has exceeded 50%. Therefore, this objective has not been met. However, wildlife data indicates the heavy use on key browse species can be attributed to livestock over grazing during summer months.

Through the consultation, coordination, and cooperation process (CCC), your input as well as input from other affected interests has been considered in the allotment evaluation process. As a result of evaluation conclusions and after consideration of input received through CCC, and in order to meet multiple use objectives established by the LUP, the following decisions are necessary:

WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT DECISION

Based on the information provided in the allotment evaluation, the technical recommendations of my staff, the input provided by the permittees, NDOW, and other interested parties, no wildlife management decision is necessary.

LIVESTOCK GRAZING MANAGEMENT DECISION

Based on the information provided in the allotment evaluation, the technical recommendations of my staff, and the input provided by the permittees and other interested parties, it is my decision to implement the following changes in livestock management within these allotments.

In accordance with 43 CFR 4110.3, 4110.3-2(b), 4110.3-2(c), and 4130.6-1(a), the current authorized livestock active use shall be decreased by 155 AUMs in Flynn/Parman and 81 in Jiggs. These AUMs shall be held in nonuse for conservation purposes, until the authorized officer determines that active use may resume. Total active preference on both allotments will be combined. The allotments will be divided into four pastures and will follow a rest rotation grazing system.

The following terms and conditions shall be made a part of all grazing permits in Flynn/Parman and Jiggs allotments:

This permit reflects your adjusted grazing preference based upon the "Allotment Evaluation" issued for a period of 10 years. Any terms and/or conditions of this permit shall be amended or changed when additional and/or new monitoring data reflects the need to do so.

Both allotments will be managed as one under a four pasture rotation grazing system. The authorized use shall follow the rest rotation schedule outlined in the Multiple Use Decision for the Flynn/Parman and Jiggs allotments. Monitoring data collected each fall will indicate any needed changes in the rotation schedule prior to next grazing season.

Each pasture has been given a set number of AUMs and a season of use. At the beginning of each grazing season the permittees will be sent a grazing application. It is the permittee's responsibility to indicate on the grazing application livestock numbers, livestock kind, and turn out dates within the season of use and set AUM level.

Livestock watering at Stimpson Spring will be restricted two out of every three years beginning with the 1994 grazing season. The spring will be fenced from livestock after May 31st during restricted years. Restricting use at Stimpson Spring will be in conjunction with the rest rotation system.

Livestock grazing will follow the above four year rest - rotation system when the pipeline from the JD well and Cave Spring Pipeline Second Extension is completed.

Salt and mineral blocks will be place 3/4 - 1 mile from any watering areas and locations will need to be approved by the Bureau.

Actual use information for each use area will be submitted within 15 days of completing grazing use as specified on the gazing permit and grazing licenses.

Prior to implementing adjustments scheduled at completion of range improvements, or at the third and fifth year evaluations following implementation of the decision, existing and future monitoring data will be evaluated to determine if the indicated adjustments are warranted and/or if any additional modifications in existing management are necessary.

RATIONALE: The analysis and evaluation of available monitoring data indicates that the current management practices are not meeting all of the multiple use management objectives for the Flynn/Parman and Jiggs allotments. The proposed temporary AUM adjustment, range improvements, and rest - rotation system will improve rangeland productivity. The increased intensity of management proposed in this decision will provide needed rest during critical growth periods for the key species and allow multiple use objectives to be met. Overall grazing pressure will be reduced with an adjustment in AUMs on a temporary basis for conservation purposes. In the long term, a four pasture rest rotation system in conjunction with the construction of two new water developments will reduce overall grazing pressure by distributing livestock better. Livestock use restrictions at Stimpson Spring will reduce the over-utilization of browse species-Antelope Bitterbrush. Continued monitoring will reflect whether or not land use plan objectives are being met.

AUTHORITY: The authority for this decision is contained in Title 43 of the Code of Federal Regulations, which states in pertinent parts:

4110.0-8: "The authorized officer shall manage livestock grazing on public lands under the principle of multiple use and sustained yield, and in accordance with applicable land use plans. Land use plans shall establish allowable resource uses (either singly or in combination), related levels of production or use to be maintained, areas of use and resource condition goals and objectives to be obtained. The plans also set forth program constraints and general management practices needed to achieve management actions approved by the authorized officer shall be in conformance with the land use plan as identified at 43 CFR 1601.0-5(b)."

4110.3: "The authorized officer shall periodically review the grazing preference specified in a gazing permit or a grazing lease and may make changes in the gazing preference status. These changes shall be supported by monitoring, as evidenced by rangeland studies conducted over time, unless the change is either specified in an applicable land use plan or necessary to manage, maintain or improve rangeland productivity."

AUTHORITY CONTINUED

4110.3-2(b): "When monitoring shows active use is causing an unacceptable level or pattern of utilization or exceeds the livestock carrying capacity as determined through monitoring, the authorized officer shall reduce active use if necessary to maintain or improve rangeland productivity, unless the authorized officer determines a change in management practices would achieve the management objectives."

→ 4110.3-2(c): "Where active use is reduced it shall be held in suspension or in nonuse for conservation/protection purposes, until the authorized officer determines that active use may resume."

4110.3-3(a): "Changes in active use in excess of 10 percent shall be implemented over a 5 year period..."

4120.3-1(c): "The authorized officer may require a permittee or lessee to maintain and/or modify range improvements on the public lands under 4130.6-1 of this title."

4130.6: "Livestock grazing permits and leases shall contain terms and conditions necessary to achieve the management objectives for the public land and other lands under Bureau of Land Management administration."

4130.6-1(a): "The authorized officer shall specify the kind and number of livestock, the period(s) of use, the allotment(s) to be used, and the amount of use, in animal unit months, for every grazing permit or lease. The authorized livestock grazing use shall not exceed the livestock carrying capacity as determined through monitoring and adjusted as necessary under 4110.3, 4110.3-1 and 4110.3-2."

4130.6-1(b): "All permits and leases shall be made subject to cancellation, suspension, or modification for any violations of these regulations or of any term or condition of the permit or lease."

4130.6-2: "The authorized officer may specify in grazing permits and leases other terms and conditions which will assist in achieving management objectives, provide for proper range management or assist in the orderly administration of the public rangelands."

APPEAL:

If you wish to appeal this decision for the purpose of a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge, in accordance with Title 43 CFR 4.470, you are allowed thirty (30) days from receipt of this notice within which to file such an appeal with the Shoshone- Eureka Area Manager, Bureau of Land Management, 50 Bastian Road, P.O. BOX 1420, Battle Mountain, Nevada, 89820. The appeal should state the reasons, clearly and concisely, why you think the final decision is in error. All grounds of error not stated shall be considered as waived [43 CFR 4.470(a)].

Subject: Grazing Application for the Flynn/Parman Allotment (GY1998)

The grazing application for the Flynn/Parman Allotment was modified February 1998 to better reflect the rest-rotation grazing system that was implemented after the Final Multiple Use Decision completed in 1993. Diamond Springs Ranch Inc. received the application and had some concerns over this system. I asked Frank Strand (Auth. Rep.) to fax a copy of his application, as he wanted to run for the 1998 grazing year. After reviewing his application I proposed the following changes:

1. Remove the Jiggs pasture from the rotation system, and allow use in this area each year below the authorized use as stated on the 10-year permit. Use in the Jiggs pasture will not exceed 65 hd from 04/01 through 10/31 or 455 AUMs. This will occur for 3 years. During the 4th grazing year the Jiggs pasture will be rested.

2. Within the Flynn/Parman area a three pasture rest-rotation system will be used with no more than 195 hd from 04/01 through 10/31 or 1,365 AUMs. In 1998 cattle will graze the Burn pasture from 04/01 through 07/30. Cattle will then be moved to the Bald pasture from 08/01 through 10/31. This will allow rest for the Stimpson pasture in the 1998 grazing year. During the 1999 grazing year (year 2) cattle will graze in the Stimpson and Burn pastures, resting the Bald pasture. And in year 3 cattle will graze in the Stimpson and Bald pastures, resting the Burn pasture.

3. During the 4th year of the grazing system use in the Stimpson pasture will not exceed 65 hd from 04/01 through 10/31 or 455 AUMs. Use in the remainder of the Flynn/Parman will be no more than 195 hd from 04/01 through 10/31 or 1,365 AUMs. Cattle will graze the Burn pasture from 04/01 through 07/30. Cattle will then be moved to the Bald pasture from 08/01 through 10/31. This will allow rest for the Jiggs pasture.

4. The Parman unit will be authorized for use from 10/15 - 10/30 as a trap to move cattle from the public land onto private.

These changes were discussed in a phone conversation between myself and Frank Strand. Frank felt this system would work with their management objectives. These changes were also discussed with Craig MacKinnon (Range Team Lead). It was determined that these changes are consistent with the grazing system in the FMUD, and will meet LUP objectives and Standards for Rangeland Health.

Terms and Conditions:

This permit or lease is issued under the authority of public law 112-74, as extended in sections 101 and 103 of Public Law 113-46, continuing appropriations act, 2014. This permit or lease contains the same terms and conditions as the expired or transferred permit or lease. This permit or lease may be canceled, suspended, or modified, in whole or in part to meet the requirements of applicable laws and regulations. This permit reflects your adjusted grazing preference based upon "allotment evaluation" issued for the remainder period of 10 Years. Any terms and/or conditions of this permit shall be amended or changed when additional and/or new monitoring data reflects the need to do so.

The multiple use decision for these allotments shows 151 AUMs from Flynn/Parman and 81 AUMs from the Jiggs to be taken as temporary non-use for conservation purposes and are listed as suspended on this permit.

Both allotments will be managed as one under a four pasture rest rotation grazing system. The authorized use shall follow the rest rotation schedule outlined in the in the multiple use decision for the Flynn/Parman and Jiggs Allotments. Monitoring data collected each fall will indicate any needed changes in the rotation schedule prior to next grazing season. This schedule will be outlined in the basic schedule. Each pasture has been given a set number of AUMs and season of use. At the beginning of each grazing season the Permittees will be sent a grazing application. It is the permittee's responsibility to indicate on the grazing Application livestock numbers, livestock kind and turn out dates within the season of use and set AUM level.

Livestock grazing will follow the four year rest-rotation system when the pipeline from the JD well and cave spring pipeline second extension is completed.

Livestock water at Stimpson spring will be restricted two out of every three years beginning with the 1994 grazing season. The spring will be fenced from livestock after May 31st during restricted years. Restricting use at Stimpson spring will be in conjunction with the rest-rotation system.

Salt and mineral blocks will be placed 3/4-1 mile from any watering areas and locations will need to be approved by the bureau.

In accordance with 43 CFR 4130.3-2(d): actual use information, for each pasture/use area, will be submitted to the authorized officer within 15 days of completing grazing use as specified on the grazing permit and/or grazing licenses.

In accordance with 43 CFR 4120.3-1(a): all range improvements shall be installed, used, maintained, and/or modified on the public lands, or removed from these lands, in a manner consistent with multiple-use management.

In accordance with 43 CFR 4130.3-2(c): in order to improve livestock and rangeland management on the public lands, all salt and/or mineral supplements will not be placed within 1/4 mile of any riparian area, wet meadow, or watering facility (either permanent or temporary) unless stipulated through a written agreement or decision.

In accordance with 43 CFR 4130.3-2(h): all grazing permittees shall provide reasonable access across private and/or leased lands to the bureau of land management for the orderly management and protection of the public lands.

In accordance with 43 CFR 4130.3-3: the authorized officer may modify terms and conditions of the permit or lease

When the active use or related management practices are not meeting the land use plan, objectives, or is not in conformance with the provisions of subpart 4180 RAC standards and guidelines.

In accordance with 43 CFR 4130.3-1 (b) - all permits and leases shall be made subject to cancellation, suspension, or modification for any violation of these regulations or of any term or condition of the permit or lease.

THIS PERMIT REFLECTS YOUR ADJUSTED GRAZING PREFERENCE BASED UPON "ALLOTMENT EVALUATION" ISSUED FOR A PERIOD OF 10 YEARS. ANY TERMS AND/OR CONDITIONS OF THIS PERMIT SHALL BE AMENDED OR CHANGED WHEN ADDITIONAL AND/OR NEW MONITORING DATA REFLECTS THE NEED TO DO SO.

THE MULTIPLE USE DECISION FOR THESE ALLOTMENTS SHOWS 151 AUMS FROM FLYNN/PARMAN AND 81 AUMS FROM THE JIGGS TO BE TAKEN AS TEMPORARY NON-USE FOR CONSERVATION PURPOSES AND ARE LISTED AS SUSPENDED ON THIS PERMIT.

BOTH ALLOTMENTS WILL BE MANAGED AS ONE UNDER A FOUR PASTURE REST ROTATION GRAZING SYSTEM. THE AUTHORIZED USE SHALL FOLLOW THE REST ROTATION SCHEDULE OUTLINED IN THE IN THE MULTIPLE USE DECISION FOR THE FLYNN/PARMAN AND JIGGS ALLOTMENTS. MONITORING DATA COLLECTED EACH FALL WILL INDICATE ANY NEEDED CHANGES IN THE ROTATION SCHEDULE PRIOR TO NEXT GRAZING SEASON. THIS SCHEDULE WILL BE OUTLINED IN THE BASIC SCHEDULE.

EACH PASTURE HAS BEEN GIVEN A SET NUMBER OF AUMS AND SEASON OF USE. AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH GRAZING SEASON THE PERMITTEES WILL BE SENT A GRAZING APPLICATION. IT IS THE PERMITTEE'S RESPONSIBILITY TO INDICATE ON THE GRAZING APPLICATION LIVESTOCK NUMBERS, LIVESTOCK KIND AND TURN OUT DATES WITHIN THE SEASON OF USE AND SET AUM LEVEL.

LIVESTOCK GRAZING WILL FOLLOW THE FOUR YEAR REST-ROTATION SYSTEM WHEN THE PIPELINE FROM THE JD WELL AND CAVE SPRING PIPELINE SECOND EXTENSION IS COMPLETED.

LIVESTOCK WATER AT STIMPSON SPRING WILL BE RESTRICTED TWO OUT OF EVERY THREE YEARS BEGINNING WITH THE 1994 GRAZING SEASON. THE SPRING WILL BE FENCED FROM LIVESTOCK AFTER MAY 31ST DURING RESTRICTED YEARS. RESTRICTING USE AT STIMPSON SPRING WILL BE IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE REST-ROTATION SYSTEM.

SALT AND MINERAL BLOCKS WILL BE PLACED 3/4-1 MILE FROM ANY WATERING AREAS AND LOCATIONS WILL NEED TO BE APPROVED BY THE BUREAU.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH 43 CFR 4130.3-2(D): ACTUAL USE INFORMATION, FOR EACH PASTURE/USE AREA, WILL BE SUBMITTED TO THE AUTHORIZED OFFICER WITHIN 15 DAYS OF COMPLETING GRAZING USE AS SPECIFIED ON THE GRAZING PERMIT AND/OR GRAZING LICENSES.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH 43 CFR 4120.3-1(A): ALL RANGE IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE INSTALLED, USED, MAINTAINED, AND/OR MODIFIED ON THE PUBLIC LANDS, OR REMOVED FROM THESE LANDS, IN A MANNER CONSISTENT WITH MULTIPLE-USE MANAGEMENT.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH 43 CFR 4130.3-2(C): IN ORDER TO IMPROVE LIVESTOCK AND RANGELAND MANAGEMENT ON THE PUBLIC LANDS, ALL SALT AND/OR MINERAL SUPPLEMENTS WILL NOT BE PLACED WITHIN 1/4 MILE OF ANY RIPARIAN AREA, WET MEADOW, OR WATERING FACILITY (EITHER PERMANENT OR TEMPORARY) UNLESS STIPULATED THROUGH A WRITTEN AGREEMENT OR DECISION.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL PERMITS AND LEASES

1. Grazing permit or lease terms and conditions and the fees charged for grazing use are established in accordance with the provisions of the grazing regulations now or hereafter approved by the Secretary of the Interior.
 2. They are subject to cancellation, in whole or in part, at any time because of:
 - a. Noncompliance by the permittee/lessee with rules and regulations.
 - b. Loss of control by the permittee/lessee of all or a part of the property upon which it is based.
 - c. A transfer of grazing preference by the permittee/lessee to another party.
 - d. A decrease in the lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management within the allotment(s) described.
 - e. Repeated willful unauthorized grazing use.
 - f. Loss of qualifications to hold a permit or lease.
 3. They are subject to the terms and conditions of allotment management plans if such plans have been prepared. Allotment management plans **MUST** be incorporated in permits or leases when completed.
 4. Those holding permits or leases **MUST** own or control and be responsible for the management of livestock authorized to graze.
 5. The authorized officer may require counting and/or additional or special marking or tagging of the livestock authorized to graze.
 6. The permittee's/lessee's grazing case file is available for public inspection as required by the Freedom of Information Act.
 7. Grazing permits or leases are subject to the nondiscrimination clauses set forth in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1964, as amended. A copy of this order may be obtained from the authorized officer.
 8. Livestock grazing use that is different from that authorized by a permit or lease **MUST** be applied for prior to the grazing period and **MUST** be filed with and approved by the authorized officer before grazing use can be made.
 9. Billing notices are issued which specify fees due. Billing notices, when paid, become a part of the grazing permit or lease. Grazing use cannot be authorized during any period of delinquency in the payment of amounts due, including settlement for unauthorized use.
 10. The holder of this authorization must notify the authorized officer immediately upon the discovery of human remains, funerary objects, sacred objects, or objects of cultural patrimony (cultural items), stop the activity in the area of the discovery and make a reasonable effort to protect the remains and/or cultural items.
 11. Grazing fee payments are due on the date specified on the billing notice and **MUST** be paid in full within 15 days of the due date, except as otherwise provided in the grazing permit or lease. If payment is not made within that time frame, a late fee (the greater of \$25 or 10 percent of the amount owed but not more than \$250) will be assessed.
 12. Members of Congress may not enter into a grazing permit or lease. 41 USC 6306 (2014). Further, no officer, agent, or employee of the Department of the Interior, other than members of Advisory committees appointed in accordance with the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5 U.S.C. App. 1) and Sections 309 of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (42 U.S.C. 1701 et. seq.) shall be admitted to any share or part in a permit or lease for grazing or derive any benefit to arise from a permit or lease for grazing.

%PL Use: Percent forage from public land use.

Type Use: Categories with specific rules that govern AUM and grazing fee calculation and input on grazing authorizations and bills.

Subject: Administrative remedy for erroneous permit terms and conditions

The Final Multiple Use Decision (FMUD) for the Jiggs (10069) and Flynn/Parman (10039) Allotments was signed on September 21, 1993. On March 23, 1998, a memorandum was signed for the casefile for Auth. No. 276071 changing the season of use and rotation prescribed in the 1993 FMUD. The authorized representative at the time requested changes via phone and annual grazing application to better fit with their management objectives for the grazing year 1998. These changes were carried over to the permit, which changed the original terms and conditions approved with the 1993 FMUD. The modification was made erroneously and without proper public consultation, cooperation, and coordination (CCC) and required decision process.

The current permit Auth. No. 2703977 will be corrected administratively to reflect original, fully processed permit terms and conditions.
