Dear Mr. Hunter:

Your letter regarding Springs jumped by Florio & Bedart came to me today, and I am very sorry to learn of same.

With regard to the Cottonwood Spring, the proof of possession I have is that I have used it as an irrigation and stock watering spring as long as I can remember, and the law with regard to such Springs was that in such usage, the consumer was in possession of it. I have constructed a water channel or ditch from Cottonwood Springs to our ranch, thereby carrying all the water from said spring to our place for domestic and irrigation purposes. Above this we have constructed small dams or ponds at different points so that our stock could water. The proper and immediate step for you to take is to clean this ditch so that the water can run freely to your main ditch, passing over the low gap on the hill between Cottonwood Canyon and Spanish Gulsh Canyon and entering the main creek through the field, and also to clear out these small ponds so that signs of labor will show. Through our usage of these springs for such purposes, the law did not require us to have these springs surveyed and recorded at that time, asour usage gave us entire cossession.

With regard to Poinson Canyon Spring, Mr. Edera and myself had a little difficulty when he jumped it, and the State Engineer in deciding the case gave us both the possession of it, enabling us both to water our stock there, and that neither of us were to put sheep in it. When I purchased Mr. Edera's properties, he gave me a deed for the Spring and ranches. The proper and immediate thing for you to do is to construct a small watering pond or dam on this spring so that your stock can water, and also that you have proof of labor on it. On all of your Springs it will be necessary for you to show a certain amount of labor each year, indicating that you are using them.

Kindly advise me as early as you can just whom is representing Mr. Florio in this case, and also whom you expect to have represent you. In this case a legal protect will be necessary through a Motary Public and not by yourself.

#### TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This will certify that, My Father, Angelo De Paoli was the owner of the Bar C Ranch prior to 1922 and prior to 1900. I was born on the above ranch and worked with my father until 1921.

The Poison Canyon Spring situated on Newark Summit was always understood to be ours as the water came down the canyon into our Bennets Spring and finally into our ranch at the White Rock intersection. Frank Sigarini at one time did place a ditch and tried to place the water own Tallhouse Canyon to his ranch, but the water did not reach his place for irrigation purposes. Our cattle and stock used the waters from this spring for many years even prior to the 1900 period. The original channel of this water ran down the canyon towards the Bennets Springs and all waters in the spring of the year ran down that channel.

The waters from the Angelo Billy Springs were always claimed by us as the waters came into our canyon through the mud springs section. Our cattle and stock watered at these waters all through the years that we remained on the ranch. In the spring of the year, the waters from this channel ran into the main stream above the old picnic grounds.

The Spanish Gulch spring, even though taken up byflorio, was always in my estimation a water that was used by our stock and the original channel ran into our ranch, as well as the Cottonwood spring. My dad and I in the early 1900's made a dtich for the Cottonwood Spring and also brought that water into the Spanish Gulch canyon and used the waters for irrigation.

I believe that the vested rights in the above mentioned waters definitely belong to the Bar C Ranch as the waters followed the natural channels to the ranch.

Any further information I shall be pleased to give.

To Whom It May Concern:

I was born in 1948 and raised in Eureka, Nevada.

From a very young age, I helped the Hunter family by working on the Hunter Ranch and riding and tending to their cattle.

Hunter's cattle grazed the surrounding mountains of the ranch from the first of April through the end of October or November depending on the weather.

The Hunter cattle utilized each and every spring in the mountains from the Cottonwood Spring north of the Hunter Ranch; to the Fairbury Well south of the Hunter Ranch; east to the Poison Spring and west to the Rhyolite Spring.

The Hunter cattle used the water in Eureka Canyon for many, many years (and created havoc within the townsite) which surfaces below the upper slag dump at the south end of the town. The creek and additional springs surfacing within the townsite continued through the town of Eureka and ran past the depot located at the north end of town.

Richmond Spring, Bullwhacker Spring and the Milk Ranch Spring were the main springs for the southern country that were utilized by the cattle belonging to the Hunter Ranch.

It is common knowledge that the Hunter Ranch (aka Simpson Creek Ranch) utilized the range and water sources prior to 1900 to present.

#### RANGE LINE AGREEMENT

In accordance with the provisions of Grazing Regulations (43 CFR 4120.1), we, the undersigned, hereby agree to the establishment or adjustment of our respective range allotment boundaries as shown on the attached map and further described as follows:

Shannon Station Allotment

Beginning at the narrows of Devils Gate on U.S. Highway 50 near the SW corner of section 24, T. 20 N., R. 52 E., M.D.M., thence in an easterly and southerly direction along U.S. Highway 50 which is the Diamond Valley Unit boundary, a distance of about eighteen (18) miles to the district line near the SE corner of section 32, T. 18 N., R. 54 E., M.D.M., thence due north along the section line, a distance of five and three quarters (5-3/4) miles to a point on the drainage divide near the NE corner of section 5, T. 18 N., R. 54 E., M.D.M., thence continuing along the district line east and north along the drainage divide of the Diamond Range to Poison Spring in the NE corner of section 12, T. 19 N., R. 54 E., thence in a north-westerly direction up the canyon on the SW side of the road along the fence to the saddle south of Alpha Peak in the center of T. 19 N., R. 54 E., section 12, NENW, thence in a southwesterly direction following the high ridges, old bladed line and fence to a point near the center of section 11, T. 19 N., R. 54 E., thence west and northwest along the ridge south of Pastorino Canyon, thence across Pastorino Canyon and around the west side of the private ground in Pastorino Canyon, thence in a northerly direction to the east

It is further agreed that the above-described allotment boundary constitutes a fair, equitable, and practical range division, based on the respective qualifications of our dependent base property under the Grazing Regulations, and as such shall be binding upon our respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors in interest or assigns.

#### REPORT OF INVESTIGATION

MADE BY H. M. PAYNE ON JUNE 24, 1925 Nos. 7127, 7128, 7129, 7131.

On the above date the undersigned in company with Mr. Florio the applicant, L. A. Harris who surveyed the springs for him, P. A. McCarran his Attorney, James Hunter and son made a Field Investigation of the sources under these applications and the protests of Mr. Hunter against the granting thereof.

The first source visited was Rich Creek Spring. It is well up in the canyon about one and one half to two miles south of the Wattles Ranch on Simpson Creek (about three east of Eureka). No works of diversion were indeed to the contract of the cast of Eureka.

The next source visited was Shirt Creek Spring No. 7128.

No water whatever was in evidence in this canyon and only 5 clump of green bushes at the point which Mr. Harris tied as the spring is in evidence to indicate the possible development/suply of water. This canyon probably comes into Simpson Creek about opposite the Watt-les Ranch. Mr. Hunter protested this application inadvertently and therefore as soon as he saw the location of same withdrew the protest.

Both of the foregoing sources were investigated without Mr. Hunter being present.

The next canyon to the east has within it a small spring applied for by Florio under the name of Choke Cherry, under No. 7129. This is the same source known to Mr. Hunter as Poison Canyon spring. At this source there was evidence that a rock dam had at some time been constructed about twenty feat below the spring. However, any reservoir which may have at one time been created by virtue of this rock dam is now filled in, about one-half inch of the continuous from the spring by this dam and on down the canyon back. The state of the second continuous for the spring by this dam and on down the canyon back.

Cottonwood Creek Spring No. 7131 is located in the next canyon to the east. This is a fairly good sized spring running about .025 c.f.s. of water. About one-half to three fourths of a mile below, the point of diversion proposed by Florio, Mr. Hunter has constructed a small reservoir about forty feet in diameter which he uses to collect the water from the spring in this canyon, as well as one in the next canyon to the east which gives him a fair head of water to run on down the canyon, the balance of the way (about three fourths of a mile) to his reach. On the date of the investigation the water from the spring was not reaching this reservoir.

After discussing these applications with Mr. Hunter and explaining that there appeared to be surplus water in all instances it was

agreed that Mr. Florio would withdraw his application No. 7129 for water from Choke Cherry/and keep his sheep away from that particular water, in consideration of which Mr. Hunter agreed not to press his protest against application No. 7131, Cottonwood Creek Spring. It was understood that we would grant permits inder numbers 7127, 7128, and 7131 and that we would withdraw from our records application No. 7129.
