Legal descriptions are prepared for water right conveyance documents. Applications to change and supporting maps are prepared to change the purchased water from irrigation to wildlife uses. Strategic planning is provided in preparation for valuation of water rights, administrative hearings, the preparation of extensions of time and other documents to maintain the acquired water rights in good standing.

Clark County, Las Vegas Valley Water District, Water Importation Supporting Maps, Las Vegas, Nevada - Field surveys and supporting maps were completed to accompany 286 +/- water right applications filed by the District. The proposed points of diversion are located through out southern and eastern Nevada. These applications were filed for future water supplies for the Las Vegas Valley area.

Reno Sparks Convention Visitors Authority, Reno, Nevada - Water right abstracting was completed to provide Orr Ditch Decree (Truckee River) water to Northgate and Wildcreek Golf Courses. Applications, field surveys and supporting maps were prepared and submitted to the Nevada State Engineer to provide water for these golf courses. Dam application was prepared and submitted for a storage reservoir at Northgate Golf Course. After completion of the reservoir, final proofs of completion were filed with the State. Facilitate negotiations on behalf of the Authority for drought water supplies to supplement currently reduced surface water sources.

Clark County Desert Conservation Program, Clark County, Nevada – Obtain the necessary documentation from the State Engineer files to conduct field investigations, field measurements and documentation to change the manner of use of xx stock water rights to wildlife use. Field locate the spring identified as the point of diversion on each of the xx stock water rights. Conduct water flow measurements and obtain sufficient filed documentation to prepare and file applications to change the use from stock water to wildlife purposes. Prepare supporting maps and water right title verification required by the State Engineer. Provide strategic planning to maintain the good standing of the existing stock water rights and the pending applications as the water right title documents are verified by the State Engineer. Prepare and file the required Proofs of Completion and Beneficial Use for certification of the wildlife use of water. Prepare and maintain an

inventory of the water rights, pending applications and status of progress.

Elko County, Nevada – Assist the County Planning Director in the development and completion of the Elko County Water Management Plan. Review draft plans prepare by the Water Planning Committee, provide recommendations and strategies for finalization of the plan. Prepare applications to appropriate municipal water to supply existing and future development in Elko County. Prepare supporting maps and documents required by the State Engineer. Provide information and status reports to the Water Planning Commission and the Board of County Commissioners.

City of Reno, Reno Sparks Convention Visitors Authority, Reno, Nevada - Orr Ditch Decreed (Truckee River) water rights appurtenant to streets dedicated to the City of Reno was determined. A chain of title from the decreed owners to the City of Reno was prepared. Approximately one fourth of the City was researched based on the budget agreed to by the Authority and the City. The City was then able to utilize identified water rights for water service to future projects. The Authority received decreed rights from the City for irrigation of Northgate Golf Course.

City of Carlin, Nevada - Water right applications and exploration well waivers were filed to construct an alternate source of water for the City of Carlin. Presentations were made on behalf of the City before the State of Nevada Interim Finance Committee which provided a \$235,000.00 grant for water supply improvement projects. Additional contributions were received through negotiations with Newmont Gold Company.

City of Tonopah, Nevada – Research the State Engineer's office and assemble an inventory of water rights owned by the City of Tonopah. Provide a status summary for each water right and recommendations to maintain the good standing of each water right until the water is place to beneficial use. Respond to questions from the City staff to address water right challenges submitted by neighboring land and water right owners. Provide recommendations to supply current and future water customers.

City of Sparks, Nevada – Research the State Engineer's office and Washoe County Recorder's office files to identify the water rights owned by the City of Sparks. Research water right title on properties owned by the City and provide documents to the State Engineer update the water right files to show the City as the current owner of record. Assemble an inventory of water rights and due dates. Provide recommendations to maintain the City water rights in good standing. Prepare and file the necessary documents as required for submittal to the State Engineer's office.

AGRICULTURAL PROJECTS:

State of Nevada Owyhee River Adjudication, Elko County, Nevada - Contracted by ten private ranch owners irrigating with water from the South Fork and the East Fork of the

Owyhee River. Field surveys, aerial photo control, field verification and mapping of approximately 10,000 acres of irrigated lands. Preparation of culture tabulations and proofs of appropriation for submittal to the Nevada State Engineer. This documentation of irrigated acreage and the types of culture utilized to designate the amount of water rights owned by the ranchers. The Owyhee River adjudication will be combined with the Snake River adjudication which is being conducted by the State of Idaho.

Water right abstracting was completed to determine the priority and ownership of Humboldt River Decreed rights on the Humboldt River and Rock Creek. Historical flow records for Rock Creek were examined to determine the impact on downstream senior water right owners and the potential storage capabilities. Responses to the BLM environmental impact analysis, the Corps of Engineers 404 permit application and the dam application submitted to the Nevada State Engineer were prepared and submitted. Operating criteria was prepared for review by Lander County and the Nevada State Engineer.

Lands of Sierra, Inc., Gamble and Wine Cup Ranches, Elko County, Nevada. Surveys, mapping, abstracting and consultation were provided for the transfer of over 10,000 acres of existing water rights, both surface and underground, to newly developed fields. Coordination of the agricultural interests during the transition of a portion of the water rights for the development of a coal fired power generation facility known as the Thousand Springs Power Project. Sierra Pacific Resources as the parent corporation of Lands of Sierra, Inc. was utilizing a portion of these ranches as a land and water resource for the power project. Other responsibilities included a detailed review of the environment impact study and report to the Sierra Pacific Resources and Lands of Sierra, Inc. Board of Directors.

Valley Bank of Nevada Trust Division, E.L. Cord Estate, and Elko, Nevada - The Estate managed by Valley Bank was represented on behalf of the Circle L Ranch. Humboldt River Decreed water rights were partitioned between three owners in an effort to settle historical confusion over the ownership of several decreed rights appurtenant to three ranches. A proposed breakdown was prepared and submitted for consideration of an agreement between the three parties.

Slash Bar H Ranch, Minden, Nevada - This ranch, formally known as the Dangberg Ranch, included deeded lands in Douglas County, Nevada and Alpine County, California. Research was completed for water rights from the Carson River Decree, surface and underground sources. An abstract of these rights and an assessment of their potential value were prepared. In addition to the water right research, a reconnaissance study was completed to determine whether historical land use on this ranch caused environmental concerns. A final report which included the above research and findings was submitted.

Truckee Carson Leasing Authority, Fallon & Fernley, Nevada, - As technical consultant, assist with the formation of an authority designed to lease Newlands Project water to municipalities for drought protection. Provide information related to value of water rights to determine range of lease values. Provide information to TCLA Members to designate acres to be dried up and allow diversion of this same water by municipal, industrial and residential water purveyors or consumers. Contracts would be negotiated to define the cost

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of annual stand by fees and delivery fees.

Clark County, Las Vegas Valley Water District, Water Importation Supporting Maps, Las Vegas, Nevada - Field surveys and supporting maps were completed to accompany 286 +/-water right applications filed by the District. The proposed points of diversion are located through out southern and eastern Nevada. These applications were filed for future water supplies for the Las Vegas Valley area.

Clark County, Las Vegas Valley Water District, Las Vegas, Nevada - Project administrator for groundwater modeling to determine impacts of high volume production wells in hydrogeographic basins, surface and underground water right abstracting, geologic data collection, endangered and threatened species data collection and consultation. Canyon General Improvement District, Sparks, Nevada - Research the State Engineer's office, Storey County Recorder's Office and Washoe County Recorder's Office to determine the water rights associated with Canyon GID. Prepare a water right inventory and due dates. Research the water right title and provide recommendations for those water right purchased and / or dedicated to Canyon GID. Confirm the status of the active water rights and provide recommendations to maintain the good standing of certified and permitted water rights. Prepare extensions of time as needed for due dates. Provide strategic planning to maintain the good standing of the water rights and to place the water to beneficial use.
