RE: Analysis of Walker River Decree C-125 Booklets

In the course of reviewing the water right submittals for the purchasing program, I have encountered two basic problems in conjunction with Decree C-125. The two problems are: (1) there have been multiple versions of the C-125 decree booklet found that suggests there was a 1940 final amended decree version that the District Court is unaware; and (2) there are at least two different claim numbering systems that are currently being used.

The following is an analysis of the decree booklets based on research at the Federal District Court - Clerks Office:

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The Special Master for Decree C-125 was a Reno attorney by the name of Robert Price. The federal judge that signed the decree was A.F. St. Sure. After the 1936 decree was issued Special Master Price was no longer associated with the suit.


In 1908 ex State Engineer Henry Thurtell submitted his findings for the Tribe with 5 priority dates and a total of 22.93 cfs (Amended Findings, p. 12). These values were later inserted unchanged into Decree 731 (1919). When C-125 was initiated in 1925, one of the goals was to increase the water flow to the reservation. Special Master Robert Price submitted his proposed decree on 12/30/1932. It has the 26.25 cfs wording and is done on Price's stationary + errors. Last minute lobbying by WRID forced the court to abandon the new values for the Tribe and the final decree was signed in 1936 with the old values (5 priority dates/22.93 cfs) intact. The Tribe protested the decree, which was moved to the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals. The Tribe then spent the next four years in court getting the Price values (26.25 cfs/ 1859 priority date) reinstated. The stakeholders signed the Stipulation on 4/22/1940 (filed in court 4/25/1940) and St. Sure signed the Order for Entry of Amended Final Decree to Conform to Writ of Mandate etc. on 4/24/1940. The court never published a printed, bound official copy of the final 1936 decree (with or without the 1940 amendment) as was done with the other major decrees.

CONCLUSION

The 1936 signed decree + the 4/24/1940 Order for Entry/Writ of Mandate that the watermaster issues is the correct and complete final decree.

In order to simplify the situation I have printed out an official signed copy of the 1936 (recorded in Lyon County by Stewart Title) and manually added the original page numbers and claim numbers with line breaks. The data was taken from a copy of the decree booklet that I received from the watermaster's office in 2001, and was checked against the 1997 NDWP database that Randy Pahl compiled. Randy and former watermaster Roger Bezayiff spent a great deal of time reviewing the database for errors. On pages 20 and 52 I included pages of the proposed decree to fill in where land descriptions on the recorded copy were clipped off. The 1940 Order for Entry is also included to make a complete version of the decree.

ORDER FOR ENTRY OF AMENDED FINAL DECREE
TO CONFORM TO WRIT OF MANDATE ETC.

The court entered its final decree in the above cause on the 15th day of April, 1936, and thereafter plaintiff having appealed, the United States Circuit Court of Appeals - Ninth Circuit - issued, on the 19th day of October, 1939, its Mandate, Order and Decree reversing in certain respects the Order and Decree of this Court entered herein, as aforesaid, on April 15, 1936, and

Plaintiff having duly filed and noticed its Motion for an order directing the Clerk to file said Writ of Mandate and for an order amending said final Decree to conform with said Writ, and

It appearing to the Court that plaintiff and defendants, through their respective attorneys, desire to clarify certain other provisions of the said Decree entered herein on April 15, 1936 as aforesaid, in order that the same will conform to the record, and

Plaintiff and defendants, through their respective attorneys, having presented to this Court a stipulation in writing, signed by all of the attorneys now of record, that the Court may enter the following Order, and good cause appearing therefor.

IT IS ORDERED that the Clerk of this Court be, and he is hereby directed to file the Mandate, Order and Decree issued by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals - Ninth Circuit - on the 19th day of October, 1939 and received by the Clerk of this Court on October 22, 1939, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that page 10 of the final Decree of this Court entered herein on April 15, 1936, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"argued before the Court in San Francisco, California and finally submitted on January 10, 1936. The Court, having considered the arguments of counsel and the evidence and having made its findings of fact and conclusions of law, and upon the 15th day of April, 1936, filed and entered its order and decree herein, and it thereafter appearing to this Court that on the 19th day of October, 1939, the United States Circuit Court of Appeals, Ninth Circuit, issued its Mandate, Order and Decree reversing the order and decree of this Court entered herein as aforesaid on April 15, 1936,

WHEREFORE, pursuant to said Writ of Mandate and in conformity therewith, it is now ordered, adjudged and decreed as follows:

RIGHTS OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

I. The plaintiff, United States of America, is hereby adjudged and decreed to be the owner of the right to divert a continuous flow of 26.25 cubic feet per second of the natural flow of the Walker River to be diverted from said stream upon or above the Walker River Indian Reservation during the irrigation season of 180 days of each year for the irrigation of 2100 acres of land situated in the Walker River Indian Reservation, in addition to whatever flow of said stream is reasonably necessary for domestic and stock watering purposes and power purposes, to the extent now used by plaintiff during the non-irrigation season, all with a priority of November 29, 1859, the date of the establishment of said Indian Reservation. The said natural flow of water of said stream and its said tributaries to be diverted therefrom at the points of diversion now used for such purpose by plaintiff or at such other points as may hereafter be selected by plaintiff for such diversion, either upon or above the Walker River Indian Reservation, provided, however, that any change in point or points of diversion sought to be made by the United States of America, to

a point or points above the present boundaries of the Walker River Indian Reservation, shall not be made except upon petition to this Court and its approval obtained after hearing upon such notice as the Court may order, and the Court expressly reserves jurisdiction of this cause for the purpose of hearing and determining such a petition or petitions.

The defendants and each of them, their several servants, agents, attorneys and all persons claiming by, through or under them, are forever enjoined and restrained from preventing or interfering with the natural flow of said quantities of water from the channels of the said stream and its said tributaries down to and upon said Indian Reservation.

RIGHTS OF DEFENDANTS RECOGNIZED IN DECREE
NO. 731

II. The parties defendant to this suit, or their successors in interest, hereinafter in this paragraph II mentioned, whose rights were adjudicated for them, or their predecessors in interest, in the decree of this Court in the suit entitled "Pacific Livestock Company, a corporation, Plaintiff, vs. T. B. Rickey, et al., Defendants" in Equity No. 731, are hereby severally."

and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Decree of this Court entered on April 15, 1936, be further amended by inserting the words "as of the 14th day of April, 1936" after the last two words "its tributaries" appearing on line 3, page 72 thereof, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that said Decree entered herein on April 15, 1936 be and the same is hereby further amended by inserting the words "of point of diversion or" after the first two words "a change" appearing on line 3, page 73 thereof, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Paragraph XVI on Page 75 of said Decree entered herein on April 15, 1936, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"XVI. The irrigation season along the Walker River, its branches and tributaries, extends from the first day of March to the thirty-first day of October of each year, except that in Bridgeport Valley on the East Walker River, and at all points above the Coleville Gauging Station on the West Walker River the irrigating

season covers the period from March first to September fifteenth of each year."

29 B. F. Curler. Upon the appointment and qualification of said
30 Robert M. Price as Special Master, further hearings were had, the
cause was argued by counsel for all of the parties to the suit.



1 and on July 24, 1931, submitted for decision. The Special Master
2 thereupon prepared and submitted to the attorneys for the several
3 parties to the suit, a proposed report, findings of fact and con-
4 clusions of law and decree, for the purpose of enabling correct-
5 ions of descriptions and in other minor matters to be made. There-
6 after the cause was, at the request of the attorneys for the sev-
7 eral parties, reopened for the presentation of further evidence
8 respecting other rights than those which had been determined in
9 the proposed decree and further hearings were had and evidence,
10 oral and documentary, presented. Thereafter the cause was further
11 argued by counsel, corrections in and additions to the proposed
12 decree were made and the cause again submitted to the Special
13 Master. The Special Master thereupon made his report to the Court,
14 submitting proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law and de-
15 cree. Objections having been made thereto by several parties to
16 the suit, the Court ordered a hearing at Carson City, Nevada, on
17 May 22, 1933, at which hearing arguments were presented at length
18 by the attorneys representing the several parties to the suit and
19 the cause was submitted to the Court for decision. The Court, on
20 May 27, 1933, referred the matter to the Special Master to take
21 further testimony respecting claimed rights of certain parties.
22 Thereupon further hearings were had and redrafted findings of
23 fact, conclusions of law and decree were submitted to the Court.
24 The Court thereafter rendered an opinion upon the questions of
25 law involved in the suit and re-referred the matter to the Special
26 Master for redrafting of the findings of fact, conclusions of law
27 and decree. The Special Master, pursuant to the direction of the
28 Court, resubmitted to the Court and to the attorneys for the sev-
29 eral parties/redrafted proposed findings of fact, conclusions of
30 law and decree. Objections to the same were filed and argued



1 before the Court in San Francisco, California, and finally sub-
 2 mitted on January 10, 1936. The Court, having considered the
 3 arguments of counsel and the evidence and having made its findings
 4 of fact and conclusions of law, orders, adjudges and decrees as

29 such parties having prior rights as herein specified have received
30 upon their several lands the waters so adjudicated to them.



1 XIII. This decree shall be deemed to determine all of
2 the rights of the parties to this suit and their successors in
3 interest in and to the waters of Walker River and its tributaries,
4 except the undetermined rights of Walker River Irrigation District
5 under its applications to the State Water Commission of the State
6 of California and the undetermined rights of the applicants for
7 permits from the State Engineer of the State of Nevada hereinabove
8 specified, and it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that
9 none of the parties to this suit has any right, title, interest
10 or estate in or to the waters of said Walker River, its branches
11 or its tributaries other than as above set forth, excepting the
12 undetermined rights of Walker River Irrigation District and the
13 several applicants for permits from the State Engineer of the
14 State of Nevada. Nothing herein shall prejudice the rights of
15 any of the parties defendant hereto under any transfer or legal
16 succession in interest since the commencement of this suit to any
17 of the rights hereby adjudicated to the several parties defend-
18 ant.

19
20 XIII. Nothing herein shall affect the right of any of
21 the parties hereto to rotate the use of water, or to combine or
22 exchange the use thereof, so far as they may do so without in-
23 juriously affecting the rights of any of the other parties here-
24 to, and the Water Master, hereinafter mentioned, may permit the
25 said parties to rotate the use of said water or to combine or ex-
26 change the use thereof, having due regard to the priorities herein
27 fixed, so far as the same may be done without injuriously affect-
28 ing the rights of the other parties to this suit.

29

30 XIV. The Court retains jurisdiction of this cause for



1 the purpose of changing the duty of water or for correcting or
2 modifying this decree; also for regulatory purposes, including
3 a change of the place of use of any water user, but no water
4 shall be sold or delivered outside of the basin of the Walker
5 River except that appurtenant to the lands of Mrs. J. A. Conway
6 and R. P. Conway referred to in the foregoing tabulation.

7 The Court shall hereafter make such regulations as to
8 notice and form or substance of any applications for change or
9 modification of this decree, or for change of place or manner of
10 use of water as it may deem necessary.

11 The owner of each ditch or canal herein authorized to
12 divert water from the Walker River or its tributaries shall at
13 his or its own expense install and at all times maintain at or
14 near the intake of such ditch or canal, a reliable, sufficient
15 and easily operated regulating headgate and a locking measuring
16 box, flume or other device to be approved by the Water Master,
17 whereby the water diverted into such ditch or canal may be regu-
18 lated and correctly measured. Upon failure of any owner of such
19 ditch or canal to install such regulating, locking and measuring
20 device on or before the first day of May, 1937, or at such earl-
21 ier date as may be fixed or demanded by the Water Master, upon
22 ten days' notice, or to maintain such regulating, locking or
23 measuring device, the Water Master shall cut off the water from
24 such ditch or canal until the same shall be so installed and
25 maintained.

26
27 **XV.** The Court, whenever it shall deem it necessary,
28 shall appoint a Water Master, who shall be charged with the duty
29 of apportioning and distributing the waters of the Walker River,
30 its forks and tributaries in the State of Nevada and in the State



1 of California, including water for storage and stored water, in
2 accordance with the provisions of this decree. / The said Water
3 Master shall serve until the further order of this Court and may
4 be removed by the Court at any time. The Water Master shall have
5 authority to appoint deputies to assist him. Upon
6 application to the Court he may employ such additional assistants
7 as the circumstances may require. The said Water Master shall re-
8 ceive an annual salary of \$, payable in monthly in-
9 stallments of \$. The compensation of his assist-
10 ants shall be fixed by the Court from time to time. The said
11 Water Master also shall be authorized to rent, furnish and main-
12 tain an office for his use and to incur necessary expenses for
13 transportation of himself and his assistants and for other proper
14 purposes, all of which shall be reported to and be approved by the
15 Court twice yearly, that is to say, on the first day of May and
16 the first day of November in each year.

17 The compensation of the Water Master and his assistants
18 and all expenses connected with his employment shall be appor-
19 tioned among the several parties hereto, both in the State of
20 Nevada and in the State of California, according to the acreage
21 of the lands irrigated under this decree, including stored water
22 and the Court reserves jurisdiction to hereafter enter judgment
23 for any unpaid portion of said expenses and to make and enforce
24 such regulations for the collection of said money as may be neces-
25 sary and proper.

26 The said Water Master, with the approval of the Court,
27 may make such rules as may be necessary and proper for the en-
28 forcement of this decree and for the carrying out of its purposes
29 and objects and the proper apportionment and distribution, includ-
30 ing rotation of the use of water where necessary, of the waters



1 of said Walker River among and to the persons entitled thereto,
2 including water for storage and stored water.

3
4 XVI. The irrigation season along the Walker River,
5 its branches and its tributaries, extends from the first day of
6 March to the thirtieth day of September of each year, except that
7 in Bridgeport Valley on the East Walker River and at all points
8 above Coleville Gauging Station on the West Walker River the
9 irrigating season covers the period from March first to September
10 fifteenth of each year.

11
12 XVII. Each of the parties to this suit shall severally
13 pay their costs therein expended.

14
15 XVIII. The Special Masters, B. F. Curler and Robert M.
16 Price, heretofore appointed by the Court "to take the evidence
17 and testimony herein, and to report the same to the Court with
18 his recommendations for the advice of the Court as to conclusions
19 of fact and of law, and as to the form and substance of the de-
20 cree to be entered" shall be paid for their several services by
21 the United States of America, such sums respectively as the Court
22 shall hereafter order.
