## **CPB'S WITNESS LIST**

COMES NOW, The Corporation of the Presiding Bishop of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, a Utah corporation sole on behalf of the Cleveland Ranch (hereinafter the "CPB"), by and through its counsel of record, Kaempfer Crowell, and submits its witness list and summary of witness statements in the above-captioned matter.

# 1. Norman L. Jones, Ph.D.

Norman Jones is currently a Professor in the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering at Brigham Young University. He is also a consultant with Aquaveo, LLC. He is the co-author of CPB\_011 (authored in 2011) and CPB\_Exh\_019. His Curriculum Vitae is CPB\_013 (from 2011) and CPB\_Exh\_020 (current, 2017).

Dr. Jones received his Ph.D. from the University of Texas at Austin in Civil Engineering. He has extensive experience in groundwater modeling. He will testify on the information in CPB\_011 and CPB\_Exh\_019 on the impact of the proposed SNWA wells on CPB water rights.

#### 2. Alan L. Mayo, Ph.D.

Dr. Alan L. Mayo is a former Professor of Hydrogeology at Brigham Young University and currently is the managing partner of Mayo and Associates, LC, consultants in hydrogeology. He is the co-author of CPB\_011 (2011) and CPB\_Exh\_019, and created CPB\_016 (2011). His Curriculum Vitae is CPB\_014 (from 2011) and CPB\_Exh\_020 (current, 2017).

Dr. Mayo received his Ph.D. in hydrogeology from the University of Idaho and has extensive experience in groundwater issues. He will testify on the information in CPB\_009 on the groundwater resource in Spring Valley and the effect of the proposed SNWA well system on groundwater in Spring Valley, as well as respond to any questions concerning the Aquaveo Reports, both CPB\_011 and CPB\_Exh\_019 as well as CPB\_Exh\_016 (2011).

#### 3. Bruce A. Roundy, Ph.D.

Dr. Bruce A. Roundy is currently a Professor in the Department of Plant and Wildlife Sciences at Brigham Young University. He received his Ph.D. in range management from Utah State University. He has extensive experience in vegetation of semiarid lands and soil and plant water relations. His Curriculum Vitae is CPB\_15 (from 2011) and CPB\_023 (current, 2017).

Dr. Roundy will testify on the information referenced in CPB\_007 (from 2011) and CPB\_022 concerning impacts of the proposed SNWA wells on vegetation, specifically in the area of CPB properties in northern Spring Valley.

#### 4. John Sanders

John Sanders is the current manager of the Delamar Valley Cattle Company, which includes CPB's Cleveland/Rogers Ranch in Spring Valley. Mr. Sanders has been with Delamar Valley Cattle since 2001 and has been manager since 2007. He has a Bachelor's Decree in Animal Science from the University of Arizona and did graduate studies at Ohio State

University. He previously managed animal science facilities at Ohio State University, University of Arizona, and Deseret Ranch in Citrus, Florida.

Mr. Sanders will testify as to the current ranch operation and water use on the ranch supporting the information contained in CPB\_Exh\_001: Water Rights, Land and Water Resources Report, July 2011. Specifically he will testify concerning the information in Section 2.

## 5. Grant S. Cooper Jr., P.E., Ph.D.

Grant S. Cooper Jr. is the current manager of the Water Resources Group, CPB. He has acted in that position since 1997. He is a licensed professional engineer in Utah and Idaho and holds a Ph.D. in Biological and Agricultural Engineering from Utah State University.

Dr. Cooper has thirty years experience in water resource engineering, design, and project management. He has responsibility for water rights and water projects for the Cleveland/Rogers Ranch. He will testify concerning the information contained in CPB\_Exh\_001 on water rights and water projects on the Ranch. Specifically he will testify concerning the information in Sections 1 and 2.

## 6. Bruce R. Scott, P.E., P.L.S.

Mr. Scott is a principal in Resource Concepts, Inc., is a licensed professional engineer, and has experience in water rights including water right surveying, applications and proofs.

Mr. Scott will testify as to the water rights held by CPB for the Cleveland/Rogers Ranch supporting the information contained in CPB\_Exh\_001: Water Rights, Land and Water Resources Report, July 2011. Specifically, he will testify concerning the information in Section 1.
