Dear Jason,

It seems incomprehensible to me that there has not been more investigation by S.N.W.A. to determine the source of water for the several carbonate springs along the west side of the Egan Range between Cave Valley and White River Valley. The warm springs that I am aware of are as follows:

	Fahrenheit Temperature
Flag Spring South	71 degrees
Flag Spring Middle	66 degrees
Flag Spring North	60 degrees
Butterfield 1 and Butterfield 2	60 degrees
Immigrant South	68 degrees
Immigrant North	67 degrees
Lund Spring	64 degrees

Together these springs flow at least 20 C.F.S. The only logical source for these warm springs is the Cave Valley Basin recharge.

There are other lower temperature springs along the same area as the warm springs. Until this issue is resolved it would be absurd to permit any water to S.N.W.A. from the Cave Valley Basin.
