The Howard Hughes Corporation is the master plan developer of the Summerlin planned community in Clark County, which is the largest planned community in Nevada, both by size and residents. Our company owns more than 6,500 acres of undeveloped land in Clark County and relies on the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) and its member agencies for the majority of its water services.
