He may testify on numerous aspects of the Walker River including flows up-stream and through the Reservation; gains and losses of surface water flows to groundwater, evapotranspiration, and irrigation diversions and drain return flows; stream gaging on the Walker River, including historic records; Weber Reservoir operation and storage-retention losses; NFWF conveyance of water rights from the Yerington Weir (point of non-diversion) through the Reservation to Walker Lake; potential and preferred NFWF Program Water accounting protocols to track, manage, and prevent detrimental harm to flows through the Reservation, including the Tribe's 26.25 cfs decreed water, and additional natural flows through the reservation; the contents and anticipated processes for implementing the MOU with NFWF (and its attachments) and underlying concerns and need to prevent any harm to the Tribe's irrigation abilities and senior priority decreed water rights; and the Supplemental Data report (Exhibit 355) utilized to develop the proposed Accounting Protocols.
